

# Geography

LO: I can explore the factors that make up quality of life across the world

Geography Week beg 4th May Download

### Warm up:

Refresher / revision on two key points:

- 1) What is a continent?
- 2) How many continents can the children remember? (Name and location)?

#### Lesson:

- A colour coded map of the world is displayed. Children should think about and discuss what the colour coding might mean. (They may well suggest population, as per last week's lesson).
- The next slide reveals that the colour coding relates to how happy people are in different countries (on average). Children are then asked to think about whether they notice any patterns in the continents.
- Children should then work through and discuss the next few slides, which ask and answer several key questions.

#### Task One:

The children are given nine factors which have been identified as key to happiness in people across all countries and continents. The children should organise these in a 'diamond 9' formation and be prepared to justify their choices to an adult in the house.



#### Task Two:

Create a presentation which demonstrates understanding of why the same key factors contribute to happiness, regardless of which country or continent someone lives in. Various forms for the presentation are suggested, as are levels of challenge:

# Challenge 1:

Create a presentation which lists the main things you think make people across the world

happy. Explain why each thing would make them happy. For example, good shelter means that a person is warm and protected from weather.

# Challenge 2:

Also refer to the reasons why the absence of that factor would make them unhappy. For example, food is quite a straightforward one (someone would go hungry), but why would the lack of an education make someone unhappy?

# Challenge 3:

Why do you think people on some continents tend to be happier than others? Do some research and present this in your findings.

# Lesson outcomes (impact)

- •Children's understanding of physical geography (continents and countries) should be reenforced and deepened.
- •Children should begin to understand that colour coding of maps can indicate different things (population or happiness rating) for example. This should avoid the misconception that colour coding of maps always means the same thing.
- •Children should begin to think about the universal things that ensure happiness (regardless of country or continent). This will set up the foundations for next week's lesson.
- •(Challenge 3) Children will start to explore the reasons behind differing levels of contentment with quality of life on different continents
