#### Strawberries

This succulent, fragrant fruit is as beautiful as it is flavourful. Traditionally the strumberry season is quite short with a six-week season from early May until late August. The use of polytunnels and glass hauses has extended the strumberry season. Although strumberries will be in plentiful supply throughout May the season will reach its peak in June and July. If good weather continues from July you can expect to see British strumberries until the end of September.



Strawberries grown on farms in the UK grow on runners from a parent plant. It's quicker thos growing from a seed. It takes five to air months for the baby strawberry plants to grow roots of their own and be roady to go to their own polytunnel.



Polytunnels are like big plastic greenhouses in the shape of a tube. Grant glass houses are also used. They let in lats of light but they keep the strawherries protested from the weather and help stop pests and diseases. Once the strawherries are planted they need to be watered every day. A special method called irrigation is used to water the soil using special pipes.



The following year the strawberry plants are mature enough to start to flower. Each flower can become a strawberry, but it needs to be pollinated by an insect. The insect pollinates the flower by crowling on it to get the nector. At the same time it rules the yellow pollen on to the inside parts of the flower. This is what makes the fruit start to grow.



Thirty days after being pollinated, the baby strawberries start to form. To start with they are small and green. As time posses and they get more water and surshine the fruits begin to grow and turn red. The polyturnel stop the birds from eating the young fruits.

A compound sentence is a sentence that has at least two independent clauses joined by a semicolon or conjunction.





# So what is a complex sentence?

A complex sentence is made up of a main clause
(a simple sentence) and then one or more dependent clauses.
There are two ways of creating dependent clauses. You can use a subordinating conjunction or add extra information with a relative clause.





A complex sentence has an independent clause and at least one dependent clause.



#### **Complex Sentences**

This KS2 English quiz will challenge you on complex sentences. You can create complex sentences by joining two simple sentences together. If you take these two sentences: 'Alec was happy' and 'It was Alec's birthday', you can create this complex sentence: 'Alec was happy because it was his birthday.' If you join the sentences with 'and', 'but', 'so', 'yet', 'nor', 'or' or 'for', you've made a compound sentence, rather than a complex sentence.

Some other words that denote a complex sentence are 'white', 'aithough', 'until' and 'after'. Make sure you know the difference between a compound and complex sentence before moving onto the next quiz. Good luck!

A figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or action that isn't literally true, but helps explain an idea or make a comparison.

E.g. My teacher is a dragon.

Similes use the words like or as to compare things

In contrast, metaphors directly state a comparison—"The moon is a white balloon."






