## YEAR 4 AUTUMN TERM 2022

### WELCOME BACK

We are delighted with how well your children have settled back into a new school year. It is wonderful to see how quickly they have settled back into the routine of school life. This year, we will be focussing on our school values of Belonging, Achieving and Growing, so look out for certificates that will start coming home explaining where your child has demonstrated one of those values. We are looking forward to a busy term ahead!

### ENGLISH

- Fiction writing – we will be reading kennings poems before creating our own link to a Roman god. We will then write a setting description for a narrative. We will also be creating information texts and considering how the structure of a non-chronological report is different to that of a story.
- In Reading we will continue to use Reading Plus and VIPERS (vocabulary, infer, predict, explain, retrieve and

### MATHEMATICS

Year 4 will follow the Maths No Problem curriculum. Pupils will develop their fluency (quick and efficient recall of number facts and times tables), calculation strategies alongside reasoning and problem solving.

It would be helpful if children were encouraged to apply their maths at home, e.g. telling the time and working out timetables, increasing familiarity with money, measuring amounts for baking, etc. It is also important to keep practising times tables and associated division facts.

### COMPUTING

This term, children will learn about e-safety where they will develop their word processing skills using Word and Publisher. They will also use an Art programme to investigate and create various effects.

### SCIENCE

We will begin this year with the Science topic of 'Living things and their habitats' where we will consider food chains, food webs and classification. We will then move onto 'Animals' including humans, where we will think about the skeleton and muscles.

### SPANISH and FRENCH

We are very lucky to have our Modern Foreign Languages taught by a specialist teacher from Twynham School. Spanish will be taught in **4AA and 4PG** and French will be taught in **4NJ and 4NS**. Teachers will also incorporate the language in their classrooms.

### TOPIC

We will begin our topic work with The Romans. We will look at how the Romans lived and their influence on the world, especially their lasting legacies in England.

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

In the first half of this term, we will study Judaism, focusing on the relationship Jews have with God. After half term, we will study Christianity, focusing on the Nativity Story.

### MUSIC

This term we will be learning and listening to music by Dave Brubeck to perform and improvise rhythm patterns. We will be listening to programmatic music on water by the composers Handel and Smetna and will create our own graphic scores.

### ART AND DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

We will start creating our own art influenced by the work of Piet Mondrian. Later we will be linking our Art and DT to our topics, as far as possible this year, as we create a range of artwork including Roman mosaics. We will also develop our paper engineering skills, creating a 3D Snowflake at Christmas.

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND GAMES

Our gymnastic and dance lessons will be taught by a specialist teacher. Outdoor games lessons will take place weekly.

Please ensure that children come into school on PE and Games day wearing the PE kits and trainers.

## PSHE

This term we will be continuing to follow the Jigsaw unit “Being Me in my World.” We will be thinking about how we belong in our school and how we can make our class a special place.

## HOME LEARNING

In order to consolidate the children’s learning, home learning tasks will be set each week.

The timetable for these tasks is as follows:

- Weekly spelling list handed out each week with words for children to learn. These lists will be set at an appropriate level for your child and we will have a spelling test every Friday morning. We will also be encouraging your child to use these spellings in their writing so that they can see the purpose behind learning new words.
- Children are set weekly tasks on Reading Plus which they are expected to complete and should aim for 85%+ accuracy. These reading activities will help them both with their reading fluency and their understanding of what they read.
- In addition, every child should read regularly at home – they should aim for an average of around 20 minutes at least 4 times per week. It would also benefit your child greatly if, when they read aloud at home, they were encouraged to discuss the language, characters and plot lines. Encourage your child to read a balance of fiction and non-fiction. Daily reading really does make a huge difference!
- Children may be given an extended task or project to complete at home during the holidays.
- Please support your child in learning their multiplication and division facts as they will need to know up to 12 x 12 by the end of Year 4. They will also be encouraged to gain their multiplication and division badges. To help with this, we ask children to practise their times tables online in addition to practising with an adult at home . Each child should try to access TimesTables Rockstars at least 3 or 4 times a week.
- Look out for Doodle maths! This is a brand new programme for the children to use. The key to Doodle maths is little and often, with children needing to stay in the green zone. Although we encourage parents to support with home learning, we ask you NOT to help with Doodle maths, as the programme create an algorithm and sets work appropriate to their level.

## TRIPS AND VISITS

Further details of trips and visits will follow in due course. We will aim to use our local environment as much as we can.
