Each week we publish the results of our attendance race and celebrate the class in each year group with the highest weekly attendance.


Why do we do this?

BARRACK ROAD CLOSURE



With a Tax-Free Childcare account, working parents will:

- get an extra £2 for every £8 paid in
- get up to £2000 per child, per year or up to £4000 if your child is disabled
- pay for childcare for children up to 11 years or 17 years if they have a disability.
