A MESSAGE FROM SUSTRANS—PARKING PROMISE SCHEME

BCP Council are trialling a Parking Promise scheme. The scheme is to help improve road safety and air quality outside our school gates whilst creating a calmer and more welcoming atmosphere for all our pupils.

By signing up to the parent parking promise, you are agreeing to -

- Walk, cycle or wheel to school wherever possible. Only drive to school if you *really* need to.
- Park at least 5 minutes from school if you need to drive, and stride/scoot/cycle the rest of the journey.
- Follow the Highway Code and park sensibly away from zigzags, double yellow lines and junctions.
- Respect our local community and park considerately keeping residents' driveways and all pavements and dropped kerbs clear
